KU's CCPC holds campus placement drive at PG Dept. of Computer Sciences



A career counselling-cum-placement drive was organized by the Centre for Career Planning and Counselling (CCPC) at the Dept. of Computer Sciences of the University of Kashmir on Thursday for B.Tech., M.Tech., MCA and MBA students of the University through Hoping Minds Pvt. Director CCPC, Prof. Geer Mohammad Ishaq while interacting briefly with the job aspirants at the Dept. of Computer Sciences laid emphasis on the need for developing twenty first century foundational skills like information technology and language proficiency, communication skills, quantitative aptitude, work and life skills among our graduates and post-graduates in order to help them compete and sustain in the highly competitive global job markets particularly in a post-COVID world where many sectors are off-loading their workers due to economic slump yet many other sectors like IT and digital platforms are recruiting skilled workforce afresh who could prove useful in their transition to digital platforms.
