

Campus Recruitment by TASL, Hyderabad organized jointly by CCPC and IoT at KU

Kashmir University's Centre for Career Planning and Counselling (CCPC) conducted campus recruitment on Tuesday during which mechanical engineers from varsity's Institute of Technology, Zakura were selected for the positions of Trainee Engineers for Tata Advanced Systems Ltd. (TASL), units at Hyderabad, Bangaluru and Nagpur.

While interacting with the representatives of TASL and job aspirants, Dr. Nisar A. Mir, Registrar, KU appreciated this initiative taken by TASL in collaboration with CCPC and IoT of KU and said that such drives are a need of the hour owing to a drastic decline in placements over the past two years seen as a result of COVID-19 pandemic and the resultant economic slump. Prof. Gowhar Bashir, Director, IoT, Zakura and Dean, School of Engineering hoped that the pandemic situation will improve in future so that more campus recruitment drives could be organized for university students in general and engineering graduates of IoT in particular.

Director, CCPC, Prof. Geer Mohammad Ishaq while interacting with the job aspirants and selectors said, "Recently we conducted a campus recruitment drive for general graduates through ExtraMarks Pvt. Ltd. and in near future we are planning to conduct campus recruitment for computer engineers and management graduates. At present IAS coaching is going on in full swing at the centre at zero cost to the students and soon we will be starting coaching for NET/JRF examination too. Further the Centre is also envisaging to offer short-term courses in career development". He further added that in collaboration with TCS Centre is imparting free of cost training in communication skills to engineering graduates at present.

TASL representative Mr. Kapil Mahajan, Head, Human Resources and Mr. Ravi Gupta, Head, Operations, TASL, Hyderabad made a presentation to the shortlisted candidates and other students of Mechanical Engineering of IoT Zakura in which they underscored the achievements and activities of TASL and highlighted the job prospects in aeronautical engineering sector. His presentation was followed by group discussion and personal interviews of the candidates.

Faculty at IoT, Zakura, Dr. Junaid Masoodi, who coordinated the recruitment process said that more than 50 students had registered for this position, out of which 20 were shortlisted for the interviews by the officials from TASL. Company needs six engineering graduates for this position at present but more such recruitments will be conducted in future.
